#### Introduction



- By virtue of a Trilateral Agreement for the Sharing, Transfer, Repatriation, Disposition and Management of Certain Forfeited Assets (**Trilateral Agreement**) by and among the Federal Republic of Nigeria, the Bailiwick of Jersey and the Government of the United States of America (together, the Competent Authorities) dated the 3rd of February 2021, the sum of **USD 311.8 million** (**Recovered Assets**) was transferred to the Nigeria Sovereign Investment Authority (NSIA or the Authority) as Implementing Authority of the Federal Republic of Nigeria under the Agreement.
- This report is provided in fulfilment of obligation of the NSIA to provide quarterly reports to the Competent Authorities under the Trilateral Agreement.
- This Report covers the period October to December 2021 (Q4 2021) and will address the following aspects:

# Funds Receipt and Disbursement Overview



- No additional recovered assets were received in the period under review.
- Treasury management activities undertaken by NSIA in the quarter yielded interest in the sum of N3,147,503,572.27.
- Disbursements were in the total sum of N21,125,196,469.76 were made from the Recovered Assets Naira Account held at the Central Bank of Nigeria, to the Contractors as follows:
  - Lagos-Ibadan Expressway N3,847,944,846.93 (to RCC IC 43 & 44)
  - Second Niger Bridge N5,110,982,105.87 (to Julius Berger IC 27, 28 & 29)
  - Abuja Kano Road N2,124,332,300.92 (to Julius Berger IC 21)
- Other expenses were: CLEEN ₦, Technical Advisers ₦; Deloitte ₦; and Custody Fees to Stanbic IBTC Bank - Nil.
