#### Introduction



- By virtue of a Trilateral Agreement for the Sharing, Transfer, Repatriation, Disposition and Management of Certain Forfeited Assets (Trilateral Agreement) by and among the Federal Republic of Nigeria, the Bailiwick of Jersey and the Government of the United States of America (together, the Competent Authorities) dated the 3rd of February 2021, the sum of USD 311.8 million (Recovered Assets) was transferred to the Nigeria Sovereign Investment Authority (NSIA or the Authority) as Implementing Authority of the Federal Republic of Nigeria under the Agreement. Furthermore, additional recovered assets USD 10.45 million and USD 20.6 million (received in December 2022), have also been transferred to the NSIA for implementation.
- This report is provided in fulfilment of obligation of the NSIA to provide quarterly reports to the Competent Authorities under the Trilateral Agreement.

## Funds Receipt and Disbursement Overview



- Recovered Funds received between January and March Nil
